Health & Human Services Salary Cap Increase

- Executive Level II Salary increase from \$187,000 to \$189,600
- Effective immediately all submissions to PHS agencies should employ the new cap
 - » Includes NIH, AHRQ, CDC and HRSA
- The Weill Research Gateway will automatically populate the cap where applicable

Health & Human Services Salary Cap Increase

Applications

All PHS/NIH grant applications will now employ this new cost cap for all personnel with a base salary at or over \$189,600

Awards

All PHS/NIH awards and subawards received with a start date on or after January 8th should employ this new cost cap for all personnel with a base salary at or over \$189,600

For awards with active periods both before and after January 8th (i.e. 11/1/17 – 10/31/2018) it is highly recommended that departments prorate salary, employing the \$187,000 cap prior to January 8th and \$189,600 cap after

Is my submission a Clinical Trial?

Does your human subjects research study meet the NIH Definition of a clinical trial?

The NIH definition of a clinical trial is very broad. Some investigators conducting human subjects research may not be aware that NIH considers their study to be a clinical trial. Use this tool to help determine if your research meets the NIH definition of a clinical trial.

For application <u>due dates on/after January 25, 2018</u>, identifying whether your study is a clinical trial will be important for:

- · picking the right NIH funding opportunity
- · ensuring your application includes all the information required for peer review
- · complying with the appropriate policies and regulations
